Literacy

This half term we will be reading Kensuke's Kingdom. The children will be using the book to work on their comprehension skills and descriptive writing.

During the first half of the term, we will focus on reading skills to prepare for SATs. After this, our focus will turn to writing for our writing assessment in June. Kensuke's Kingdom provides us with many opportunities for some fantastic descriptive writing along with some real life examples of newspapers.

Our grammar focus will be revising what we have learnt so far this year.

Physical Education

We are focussing on team games including dodge ball.

ICT

The children will be applying their programming skills on topic based project.

Maths

During this half term, we will be revising all the topics covered so far this year in preparation for the SATs tests. This will help children to feel confident and prepared to sit the tests and also recap subjects that may not be fresh in their minds. Miss Riley and Miss Barker are also running in-school revision clubs for children who feel like they want extra help or support. We want our children to feel happy and prepared for the statutory tests.

Homework

Much of our homework will be revision based for this term to give children the best chance of success.

Reading daily will help children with their fluency speeds and vocabulary.

Mathletics and TT Rockstars websites are useful for practising maths skills.

SPaG.com has SATs style tests for practise.

All children also have CGP revision books.

Year 6 treats

We understand just how hard our year 6 children have been working this year so we have introduced 'treats' to reward the children who always put 100% effort in. Ask your child about their target card—this is used to keep track of their behaviour and effort. Those with enough points at the end of every week will qualify for the treat.

SATs Week

No holidays/appointments will be granted during this week.

If your child is off ill, they will still have to sit the test at a later date, please contact the school in this instance for what to do.
