The children will be continuing to use the concrete equipment to help their understanding before we move on to using more formal methods. We will be investigating measure by looking at length, perimeter and money. We will complete lots of practical activities to embed the children's learning as well as challenging them with many problem solving tasks. This will give them chance to apply their new skills and knowledge in different ways. At the end of the half term we will learn about statistics. We will look at different ways to represent data, including using bar charts, pictograms and tables. We will also use these skills in our learning in Science and DT.	<ul> <li>We will be asking the question, 'Why do Christians call the day Jesus died, Good Friday?'</li> <li>We will look at the Easter story and revisit learning from KS1. We will then begin to look at the Bible's Big Story, thinking about the timeline of creation, fall, incarnation, gospel and salvation.</li> <li>We read the bible text and think about what the entry into Jerusalem, and the death and resurrection of Jesus might mean. After this we will we be able to give examples of what the texts studied mean to some Christians.</li> <li>This unit will also help us make simple links between the Gospel texts and how Christians mark the Easter events in their church communities. We will also consider how Christians show their beliefs about Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday in worship.</li> <li>At the end of the unit we will make links between some of the stories and teachings in the Bible and life in the world today, expressing some ideas of our own clearly.</li> </ul>

## We are also studying:

We will be learning about plants. We will look at the parts of a plant and the functions, the life cycle of a plant. We will investigate how water is transported and also look at pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal. PUPILS WILL KNOW THAT: Plants create their own food. Different parts of a plant have different functions. Plants have a unique life cycle.	We will be learning about the Bronze Age and the Iron Age. We will learn about the Ages using a timeline, we will compare different features and we will look at a specific case study. We will continue to explore different artefacts and think about how historians use these to discover what happened in the past. PUPILS WILL KNOW THAT: The Bronze Age and Iron Age happened after the Stone Age. These ages changed the world to how we live now. The Ages were named after the main material of that time.	We will be continuing our theme of Health and Wellbeing. We will look at celebrating achievements and setting high aspirations. We will investigate conflicting emotions and how to manage these feelings. We will also look at changes in life and how these can affect how we feel PUPILS WILL KNOW THAT: They are able to develop strategies to help them manage a variety of emotions	We will be exploring the song: Bringing Us Together – Joanna Mangona and Pete Readman. We will continue to appraise songs commenting on why we like them and what we notice about them. We will continue to compare different styles of songs. We will learn how to follow a beat and join in with a melody to create a performance for our focus song. PUPILS WILL KNOW THAT: Music has a beat. Music can be performed in lots of different ways.	We will be looking at cooking, healthy eating and nutrition. At the end of DT week, we will show that we can understand and apply the principles of a healthy diet. We will also be able to explain what a varied diet is. We will also design, prepare and cook simple savoury dishes using some cooking techniques. PUPILS WILL KNOW THAT: They need a healthy balanced diet They need to be hygienic when cooking They can use basic cooking skills including using a knife safely.
