Maths

Spelling

In the back of your planner there is the Year 3 and 4 word list. These words are what we call our '**jumping orange words**'. You could do some activities with these like:

- Look, cover, write and check
- Time yourself- how many times can you write the word in one minute or how many words can you write from the list in one minute?
- Draw a picture and add your words to it
- Create word pyramids-use blue for consonants and red for vowels.
- Write silly sentences
- Write them backwards
- Create a word search
- Play hangman
- If you have an old paintbrush you could use water to paint the words somewhere outside

Writing

We have written lots of instructions in class so you could write a set of instructions about what to do each day whilst you are not in school. You could write a letter to your friend or a family member or keep a diary of what you have been up to.
