Year 6 expectations: each day, you must complete:

- 20 mins of reading a book
- 1 x reading comprehension task (from any of the reading comprehension books)
- 1 × 10 min test in maths
- 15 mins on TT Rockstars
- 1 × mini maths
- 30 mins on Clasroom Secrets on any subject (vary it each day)
- Weekly 1 x arithmetic from mini maths

This is less than 2 hours of work per day. If you want to do more, you are welcome to, however, do not over-face yourself. This will be enough to keep your brains ticking over.

SPaG.com will be set up so that you have a range of quizzes to work on. Use your revision book to help you. Your password is in your planner.

Research topics for foundation subjects:

History: You could research a historical person from the war e.g Anne Frank.

Can you find out any interesting facts about World War II? The war caused a lot of things to happen that may not have otherwise e.g the computer and even space travel. What can you learn about this?

Geography: Why not research some of the men on the Endurance expedition? Find out what happened to people like Frank Wild and Henry McNeish when they returned from their journey.

Can you find information on any other explorers? Where did they go? What did they achieve?

Create a project on climate change. You can choose any area you wish e.g plastic pollution, heroes and villains of climate change, etc. Or you could do a poster about the divisions of the earth (e.g longitude and latitude).

Science: How have animals from the polar regions adapted to survive in the cold climates? Then look at other animals adaptations from around the world.

Present information on what you've already learnt about the circulatory system. You could create an informative poster.

Other topic based research tasks are added to Google Classroom to give you ideas of activities you could do.

Remember to use this time wisely! Enjoy time with your family, help around the house and have a good rest. Like they used to say in the war, keep calm and carry on!
