We keep our children safe...

by asking parents to read and understand the ratings for the video games they may be buying for their child.

Video games in Europe are rated by PEGI. This rating gives an idea of what sort of content is included. PEGI also lists a number of reasons for their rating, including drug use, discrimination or violence. Additionally parents need to be alert to the new and emergent problems with some games such as simulated and real gambling and online gaming with strangers.

It is really important to take the time to talk about the games your child is playing. Talking to your child about the games can help you understand more about their content and voicing your concerns ensures that your child understands the risks. It is important that your child feels that they can come to you if something happens that worries or frightens them.
