Thank you for supporting us by regularly testing your children with LFTs. Staff continue to test twice weekly and do daily tests if they are a contact of a positive case.

During this week, we have 32 children and 5 staff off ill with COVID-19, with outbreaks in classes USA, Germany, Ireland and France. We are doing all we can to keep classes open and I personally thank staff for being flexible and stepping up to the challenge of the last few weeks. We will endeavour to keep things as normal as possible until we have recovered from this wave. Please remember that if you have any concerns you can speak to your child's teacher, myself, our Learning Mentor or ring the office. If your child needs to be off school and is well enough to complete school work at home please let the office know. Teachers can provide paper packs of work or work on Google Classroom. Chromebooks can be provided to those who are isolating and do not have access to a laptop or tablet at home. Please just ask.

Night OWLS is a free overnight crisis line for families in Calderdale. For more information please see the leaflet attached to this newsletter.

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

As well as using the YouTube Kids app, you As well as using the YouTube Kids app, you can also set up nestrictions on other ways, your farmily waitches YouTube. Ensure you are logged in when using YouTube and turn on Thestricted Mode' in your User Pooffis, You can also set this at the bottom of the video page by citizing Teatricted Mode. On! Ensure that you also clickthe Took Restricted Mode' on this browser to ensure other users can't turn it off.



WATCHING TOGETHER

Another good way to leasy TouTube viewing positive is to spend time finding channels and content that your child will enjoy and benefit then. For example, a suggested family activity could be to get together once a month and show each other your ferenties ideas in from the last four wisels. This not only sparks conversations about what you've watched but also enables you've watched but also enables you to share the things that you've enjoyed watching



RECOMMENDATIONS

For younger children, you can use the YouTube Kids app to keep table on what they have been watching. Tap-on the Raccemmended icon on the top-of the home screen and then swipe right. You self are videous with the play button on them and a red bur at the bettom. These are the videou your child has watched. Anywhere the bar at the bottom is most black in a video your child has skipped.

Overnight West Yorkshire Listening/Advice Service, is for all families including those with children and young people who are looked after, adopted or have any additional needs who are in crisis or struggling with their mental health.

Night OWLS is a confidential support line and online chat facility that helps young people get virtual support when they need it. It provides a safe space where someone can listen and show warmth, acceptance and understanding; offers a chance to look at ways for children and young people to cope and to keep themselves safe; supports with finding solutions to problems, and provides information about local services for carers.

They are available 8pm-8am every day for children, young people, parents and carers across West Yorkshire.

The service was designed in collaboration with young people and parent/carer groups including Family Voice Calderdale across West Yorkshire. The groups involved represent a variety of interests, including neurodiverse needs, SEND, Mental Health, Looked After and adoption which brings a richness of involvement in the shaping of the service, a wide representation of families' voice and understanding of needs.
