Chat around the table

This week (and next week for Years 3 & 4) we have been cooking healthy meals and learning about a balanced diet. Speak to your child about the food they have made and how they can make the same healthy food at home.



SATs week

The week beginning Monday 9th May is SATs week for our Year 6 pupils. Please can we ask that children arrive promptly at school on these days and that children are well rested and fed a good healthy breakfast. We know that our children will do their very best in these tests and know that giving them the best start to the day will give the children the best opportunity to succeed.

Reading

Thank you to those families who have had a sort out at home and returned any missing library books. Our library is looking much healthier now! If you do have any more books at home which need returning, please do so as soon as possible. Children should come home with a reading book daily. They then do a quiz on their book using the 'Accelerated Reader' scheme. More information can be found on our school website.

https://standrews.calderdale.sch.uk/learning/curriculum/lit eracy/. We aim for each child to pass 3 quizzes (scoring 80% or more) before moving up a level on Accelerated Reader. Did you know that some of our books (on our dyslexia friendly shelves) have QR codes which can be scanned so that an audio version of the text can be heard? These books are also printed with a dyslexia friendly font and paper.

Breakfast Club Price Increase

After Easter the price of our Breakfast Club sessions will increase from £3.00 to £3.50. The cost of the sessions has not been increased for a number of years. It is a non-profit club and we do our best to keep costs down, however, it is currently running at a loss which the school cannot afford to sustain. Please be aware that there may be a need for a further price rise going forward, however, we do feel that the Breakfast Club still represents good value compared to other settings. Pupil Attendance

We regularly monitor our pupils attendance and the expected attendance target set by the government is **96% or above**. If your child's attendance falls below the expected target we will inform you by text and continue to monitor

it. We appreciate that children get ill from time to time and their attendance may drop temporarily. However, if we feel your child's attendance is becoming a cause for concern we will contact you by letter. Please support your child to achieve good attendance.



COVID

Unfortunately, over the last few weeks we have seen a significant rise in Covid19 cases in school amongst pupils and staff. I would like to personally thank the staff who have stepped in to cover various classes to support our pupils. Luckily we have managed to remain open and have not had to move to blended or home learning. Because of the high number of cases, I would like to ask that any parents or carers attending the Easter church service next Friday wear a **face covering** to help to reduce any further cases in our school community.




