Literacy


This half term we will be reading the texts Moth: And Evolution Story and Varmints.

Our grammar focus will be on verb tenses including the perfect tense and the progressive tense. Children have grammar revision books to help them learn new terms but also to recap any previous learning.

PUPILS WILL KNOW THAT:

- Sikhism is a religion that originated in India, but is now practiced throughout the world
- A Sikh place of worship is called a Gurdwara
- Sikhs follow the 5 Ks in their lives
- Sikhs believe in one God, who is not described as male or female
- There are 10 Gurus in Sikhism. They are the messengers and guides from God and the link between God and humans.

We follow the journey of Charles Darwin to learn about evolution and look at other scientists who had similar ideas before Darwin. PUPILS WILL KNOW THAT: Humans, animals and plants have adapted to survive in their environments Evolution is a process which happens through adaptations over hundreds, thousands or even millions of	We will be learning about mountains and volcanoes. Using atlases, we will identify physical features of countries around the world including mountain ranges, volcanoes and earthquake zones. We will look at the UK and identify where there are mountains and why there are no active volcanoes or series earthquakes. PUPILS WILL KNOW THAT: Tectonic plates determine where earthquakes occur How mountains and volcanoes are formed Volcanoes erupt when magma rises to the surface How to use an atlas to locate areas of mountains, volcanoes and earthquakes.
