## Breakfast Club

Our Breakfast Club opens at 7.45am. Please do not send your child to the out of school provision before this time.

#### Car Park

Our car park is for staff only. It is **not** safe for our pupils to walk through. Please avoid using this car park, particularly when picking up from after school care. We understand that parents/carers are often in a hurry but the car park is dark and has hidden spots making it difficult for drivers to see if a child was stood there. Please keep your child safe by abiding by this request.

#### School Gates / School Opening Times

Our school gates to the playground open at 8.30am and the classroom doors open ten minutes before the school day starts at 8.40am. Our school day officially starts at 8.50am. Please do not arrive at school before our doors open unless you are using our Breakfast Club. We open our doors 10 minutes early to allow parents or carers time to get to the Infant School. It is not necessary to arrive at school before 8.40am as it causes congestion on the paths meaning that families need to walk on Waterloo Road to get around families waiting by the gate. The ten minute drop off window should provide a sufficient amount of time to drop off your child. Thank you for your understanding.

Retail and food prices continue to rise, especially domestic produce which have been impacted by poor harvests, labour shortages, and rising global food prices. 85% of Britons have noticed an increase in the cost of groceries. 3,150 people access <u>food support</u> on a monthly basis across Calderdale. Partners are working together to look at how more affordable food options can be made available. The Council's <u>welfare assistance</u> scheme can help people with essential household items, such as a cooker and fridge

Health & Wellbeing: The cost-of-living crisis is having an impact on <u>mental</u> <u>health</u>, especially for those most vulnerable, and it's important this isn't ignored. #### Support with budgeting and paying rent

It has never been more important to know how to manage a household budget and many people don't have these skills. There are lots of resources online, but if face to face support is needed, there are a range of organisations who can help maximise your client's income and they are listed <u>here</u>. If you are worried about a client's risk of becoming homeless, contact the <u>Housing Options</u> team. The demand for rental housing is extremely high, making it challenging for low-income households to move. Where possible, staying put may be the best option, but if you're unsure, please contact the Housing Options Team.



Managing **household costs** is becoming increasingly more challenging for more families and households, but there are some schemes in place to help:

- All households will be given a £400 cash discount on energy bills this autumn.
- All households in council tax bands a -d will be receiving a <u>council tax rebate</u> of £150.
- Low-income households on means tested benefits will receive a £650 cost of living payment (lump sum payments to be made in July and then the autumn of 2022)
- Pensioners qualifying for the winter fuel payment will receive a one-off payment of £300 towards the end of the year to help with energy costs.
- People claiming disability benefits will receive a one-off disability payment of £150 in September.
- Warm Home Discount and Winter Fuel Payments will be available to eligible households.
- The local <u>welfare assistance</u> scheme is a discretionary scheme run by Calderdale Council and provides emergency support for people in most need with household items.
- Top tips for a warmer, healthier home can be found <u>here</u>. It contains some simple measures to make homes cheaper to heat.
- It's also easy to find out if someone is eligible for help to pay rent or Council tax <u>here</u>. If a client is still struggling to pay their rent, they may be eligible for <u>discretionary housing</u> payment.

Since September 2021, Calderdale Council has been distributing <u>household support</u> directly to vulnerable households. A total of £3,666,006.92 will have been spent by end of September 2022.

Frontline services are busier than they ever have been, and clients should be enabled wherever possible to build on their financial knowledge, confidence and budgeting skills to relieve the ongoing demand for services.

Hints and tips on maximising household income and managing a household budget will be scheduled over the coming months as part of our planned cost of living campaign. Please visit the <u>Calderdale</u> <u>Money and Wellbeing Information Centre</u> regularly to find out more.

We know that a nudge from a loved one can be a powerful motivator so if you are talking directly to friends and family, use this factsheet to encourage them to find solutions to any money worries.
