Year 4 Summer 1 Curriculum Overview

Key learning this half term

Literacy	Maths	Religious Education
This half term we will be reading the text The Firework Maker's Daughter by Philip Pullman and Bill's New Frock by Anne Fine.	 We will write order and compare decimals. We will also round decimals to the nearest whole number and focus on halves and quarters and their decimal equivalents. After the focus on decimals, we will build on this by looking at money. We will look at pounds and pence and order amounts of money. We will then estimate money. We will also add and subtract using money and work out the correct change. We will recap telling the time to the nearest minute. We will also look at measurements of time (E.g. seconds, minutes, days, weeks). We will also look at converting analogue time to digital time. There will be a statutory Multiplication Tables Check in Summer 2. In order to prepare for this, we will continue to practise our times tables. 	 We will be asking the question, What does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today? We will explore the importance of deities to Hindus and learn how they are celebrated. We will learn how Hindus prepare for important festivals and why they are so significant to their lives PUPILS WILL KNOW THAT: Hindus believe that all living things are special and sacred. There are several Hindu deities that are represented in different forms. Diwali is an important festival. Mandir is the name of the Hindu place of worship.

We will be learning about sound. PUPILS WILL KNOW THAT: volume and pitch are different and how we can change them. They will know that sound can be recorded in decibels and will know the conditions needed for sound to be created and heard.	We will be learning about our locality by doing a study of our community. PUPILS WILL KNOW: how to calculate the length of a journey using digi-maps, facts about the physical and human features of our locality and how to use grid references on maps.	We will be learning about building healthy relationships. PUPILS WILL KNOW ABOUT: about rights and responsibilities and how to look after good relationships. They will also aim to identify the traits of unhealthy relationships and what we can do if we see them.	We will be looking at how music shapes our way of life. PUPILS WILL KNOW: How music helps our moods from day to day. We will explore the impact music makes on our lives and we can use it to raise spirits.	We will be learning about printmaking and digital art. PUPILS WILL KNOW: what pointillism is and how to use it in their artwork. They will know who Georges Seurat is and how to emulate his work They will know how to use pixel art.
