#### Medical Needs

In our aim to help pupils further we have made some changes to what medication we can administer.

Parents and carers will be receiving an online form to complete which will allow staff to administer Calpol or Piriton should the need arise in an emergency.

Before the medication is administered, our staff will ensure that online consent has been given and they will also call parents or carers to ask for verbal permission on the day.

Staff will ask parents whether any medication has been administered at home that day and if so, how much. This is to ensure the child is given the appropriate dose.

#### Who is eligible?

Those that can access clubs free of charge are:

- + school aged children from reception to Year 11
- + who are in receipt of benefits related free school meals in Calderdale

## There are funded or subsidised places for some other children, which include:

- + Children assessed by the local authority as being in need, at risk or vulnerable.
- + Young carers.
- + Children in care or children previously in care.

+ Children with special educational needs and/or disabilities who have been identified will benefit from HAF.

+ Children who have low attendance rates at school or who are at risk of exclusion.

+ Children living in areas of high deprivation or from low-income households who are not in receipt of free school meals.

- + Elective home educated children.
- + Young offenders.
