
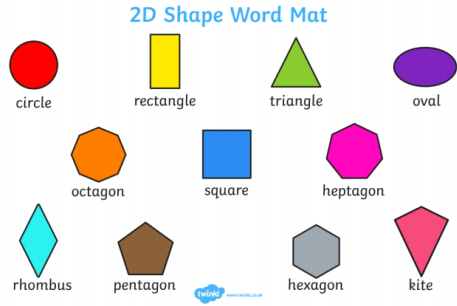

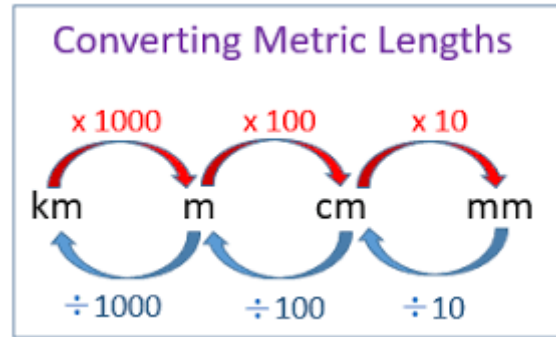

- We learn why people undertake a pilgrimage and why it is important to them.



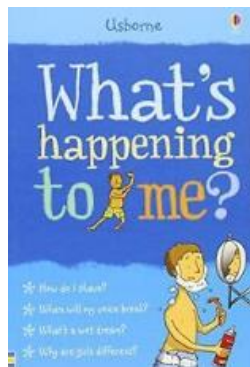
