# Headteacher's Message

Thank you to all the parents and carers who have responded to the questionnaire I sent out. As a school we always value feedback and strive to improve. The results are overwhelmingly positive and massively reflect the hard work and dedication shown from the St. Andrew's team.

The key takeaways from our report are that from the responses received:

Every parent or carer has stated that their child feels safe at school.

Children feel extremely happy at school.

Parents know that their children are taught well at school.

Nearly all pupils access the lunchtime or after school clubs available.

Not one family disagreed or strongly disagreed with whether the school is well led and managed.

Families receive a good amount of information about how their child is working and what they're covering in class.

Behaviour is exceptional.

The comments on what we're doing well show that families feel children are cared for and nurtured. Our caring vision came across extremely positive in the responses.

We have had some new children join our school and so I would like to firstly welcome them and their families and also respond to some queries in the questionnaire and ensure that all adults know what information is available.

Firstly, families were asked whether they receive information about what their child is learning in school. I would like to signpost our families to the information shared throughout the year. Teachers send out a half termly curriculum letter. This sets out exactly what is being covered in the upcoming half term (6 per year) and the key vocabulary which is being taught. We also invite families to an information evening in September and during this meeting, teachers discuss the main topics and objectives being covered. The curriculum letters are also available on our website should the link only go to one parent for example. Secondly, I asked the question as to whether families receive valuable information about their child's progress. Teachers meet with parents and carers in October and discuss how their child has settled in. At Christmas and Easter parents and carers receive a Promoting Excellence report. These reports state how their child is performing in reading, writing and maths. Teachers also send home targets and colour code information such as attitude to learning, behaviour, punctuality etc. In March our teachers meet with families for a second parents evening. This is then followed by an end of year report in which teachers comment on progress and attainment in each area of the curriculum. Our families are more than welcome to discuss these reports with teachers on  $10^{th}$  July and should make an appointment if they wish to do so.

# Holidays during term time

Please be reminded that from September there will be some changes being made to the prosecutions for families taking holidays during term time.

Taking holidays in term time will affect children's schooling as much as any other absence and we expect parents to support us by not taking children away in school time. In line government guidance, the Headteacher will not grant any leave of absence for holidays in term time. Holidays taken in term-time will be recorded as 'unauthorised' and the authority will administer fines should holidays be taken.

Fines from Calderdale Local Authority will be £80 per parent per child. This fine increases if not paid within 14 days. This includes fines going to any stepmother or stepfather who take the child on holiday whether or not they have parental responsibility. The fine will not go to a parent who does not take the child on holiday. For example if a child lives with mum and stepfather and they go on holiday, they will both receive a fine for the child.

# Parking

Please can we ask again that parents do not park on the zig-zag lines directly outside school. This THINK TH is extremely dangerous. 
Children from all year groups have been busy making their fantastic Science boards this term! From Hybrid Cars to The Solar System, the children produced some amazing work.

#### EAST team collect details from the family

Conversation with the EAST team with the parent to understand feeding status and financial need – complete request form that will go on to Health Visitor.

**e-voucher issued to the family** for a supermarket and guidance given on how to redeem – can be sent by email, text message or printed and collected from Customer First, Halifax.

#### Voucher spent at chosen supermarket

EAST can check where the voucher has been redeemed.

#### Family referred to the Health Visiting Service

#### Health visitor follow up

HV team reports to admin who notify the infant feeding team and the duty team for the area in which the family live. HV contacts the family within 10 working days and does a full health assessment with the family. Referrals made to appropriate support services.
